
6 Atlantic Basin Hurricanes








The National Weather Service in Northern Indiana has issued a

- * Tornado Warning for... Northern Allen County in northeastern Indiana... Northwestern Paulding County in west central Ohio...
- * Until 300 AM EST
- * At 231 AM EST, a severe thunderstorm capable of producing a tornado was located near Huntertown, or near Fort Wayne, moving east at 75

HAZARD...Tornado and quarter size hail.

SOURCE...Radar indicated rotation.

IMPACT...Flying debris will be dangerous to those caught without shelter. Mobile homes will be damaged or destroyed. Damage to roofs, windows, and vehicles will occur. Tree damage is likely.

* This dangerous storm will be near... Grabill around 240 AM EST. Woodburn around 245 AM EST. Antwerp and Payne around 250 AM EST. Paulding around 255 AM EST.


Other locations impacted by this tornadic thunderstorm include Worstville, Cuba, Leo-cedarville, Latty, Harlan, Briceton, Cecil, Wallen and Broughton.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

TAKE COVER NOW! Move to a basement or an interior room on the lowest floor of a sturdy building. Avoid windows. If you are outdoors, in a mobile home, or in a vehicle, move to the closest substantial shelter and protect yourself from flying debris.



IMPACT....Flying debris will be dangerous to those caught without shelter. Mobile homes will be damaged or destroyed. Damage to roofs, windows, and vehicles will occur. Tree damage is likely.







NWS Hazardous Weather Outlooks

THIS HAZARDOUS WEATHER OUTLOOK IS FOR PORTIONS OF NORTHWEST OHIO... NORTHERN INDIANA AND SOUTHWEST LOWER MICHIGAN.

.DAY ONE...TODAY AND TONIGHT

THERE IS A HIGH RISK OF SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS THIS AFTERNOON AND THIS EVENING. SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS WITH DAMAGING WINDS AND POSSTBLY TORNADOES... ARE EXPECTED TO MOVE THTO WESTERN PORTIONS OF THE AREA BY EARLY AFTERNOON... THEN TRANSITION TO A LINE OF SEVERE STORMS WITH WIDESPREAD DAMAGING WINDS AND ISOLATED TORNADOES AS THEY MOVE ACROSS OUR AREA THIS AFTERNOON AND THIS EVENTING. THE STORMS ARE EXPECTED TO BE MOVING EAST TO NORTHEAST AT 50 TO 60 MPH. IN ADDITION... IT WILL BE VERY WINDY TODAY AND TONIGHT... EVEN OUTSIDE OF THUNDERSTORM ACTIVITY... ESPECIALLY LATE THIS AFTERNOON AND THIS EVENING WHEN WIND GUSTS TO 60 MPH ARE EXPECTED.

.DAYS TWO THROUGH SEVEN...MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

- A rapid rise in water that is a threat to life and property









NWS Warnings

When Severe Weather is Imminent

Take Shelter Now!

Severe Thunderstorm Warning

- Thunderstorm wind gusts ≥ 58 mph & or:
- Hail ≥ 1 inch in diameter



- Doppler Radar indicated rotation
- Confirmed reports of a tornado

Flash Flood Warning

- 6 inches or more of flowing water over roadways
- A rapid rise in water that is a threat to life and property


NWS Strategic Outcome: A Weather & Water-Ready Nation
